MORNING WORSHIP

Distance Learning “Paul’s Legacy” 2 Timothy 2:1-13

1. Paul wanted to pass on to Timothy a legacy of faithful influence. (vv. 1-2)
 - Influence is automatic—intentionality is not.
 - Influence is most powerful when we invest our lives in something greater than ourselves.
 - Influence should naturally flow from Christian maturity.
2. Paul wanted to pass on to Timothy a legacy of faithful endurance. (vv. 3-7)
 - Endure like a dedicated soldier.
 - Endure like a disciplined athlete.
 - Endure like a hard-working farmer.
3. Paul wanted to pass on to Timothy a legacy of faithful allegiance. (vv. 8-13)
 - Allegiance to the Gospel.
 - Allegiance to the Word of God.
 - Allegiance to the Mission.

EVENING WORSHIP

Jeremiah: Faithful to the Mission “Crisis Shepherding” Jeremiah 23:1-40

1. God provided hope in the midst of a spiritual crisis through Jeremiah’s faithful shepherding. (23:1-5)
 - Judah faced destruction and exile because of failed spiritual leadership.
 - Judah received the promise of physical restoration ultimately.
 - Judah received the promise of spiritual restoration ultimately.
2. God provided discernment in the midst of a spiritual crisis through Jeremiah’s faithful shepherding. (vv. 9-40)
 - Jeremiah exposes the disgraceful conduct of the false prophets. (vv. 7-15)
 - Jeremiah exposes the dishonest message of the false prophets. (vv. 16-32)
 - Jeremiah exposes the disrespectful attitude of the false prophets. (vv. 33-40)
 - Jeremiah revealed an important truth about the Word of God.
 - The Word of God is like fire and like a hammer.

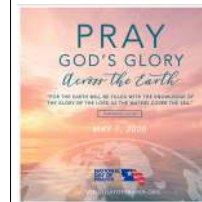
